

It was a lovely Saturday evening for a match, and it turned out to be a very entertaining high scoring match, with the right result in the end!!

Darren O'Reilly, again playing in his new role at full forward, got the first score board with a nice point in the first minute. Clontarf answered a minute later from a 45. Darren and Clontarf exchanged points again in the 8th and 9th minutes. The visitors went one ahead before Warren Egan fisted an equaliser. A minute later he finished to the far corner of the net from a tight angle. Over the next 5 minutes, Clontarf regained control with 2 two points (1 free) and a goal to put them two points ahead. The next four points were all by Boden from (new father) Collie Dunne, Kieran Kennedy with his left foot, Alan Flood and Warren Egan. Clontarf responded with a point. As we entered added time, Mikey Dunne got his name on the scoresheet and Clontarf finished the scoring with a point from a 45 to leave the half time score at 1 - 8 to 1 - 7.

Clontarf got off to a flying start with four points (2 frees) without reply in the first 8 minutes. Warren Egan got one back from a free, but Clontarf quickly cancelled this out. Then came a purple patch for Boden. First, Warren Egan converted a free on 12 minutes. Then in the space of a minute, Darren O'Reilly rattled the Clontarf net twice. The first followed good work by Alan Flood and the final pass for the second was supplied by Warren Egan after James Holland had won the Clontarf kick-out. A minute later Alan Flood added a point to leave his side five points ahead with 15 minutes left. By the 20th minute, Warren Egan had converted two more frees to cancel out two points by Clontarf. Mick McDonald then got his first point in senior football and as we entered added time. Another two Under 19 players, Kieran Kiely and Robbie O'Reilly, made their senior debuts and one of these, Kieran Kiely, didn't take long to make his mark with a good point. Clontarf added two more points and Ciarán O'Reilly brought the curtain down with a point after a good team move. Intense Inters prevail in local derby

"It was an excellent, well rounded team performance", said mentor James O'Hara following the meeting of the intermediate footballers and St. Jude's in the 4th round of the Adult Football League. He went on to say, "the hard yards in training came to fruition with a near perfect team performance." Former player turned mentor James, who hails from Monaghan, was speaking via an interpreter following Saturday evening's local derby.

From the throw in, Boden brought an intensity that Jude's found difficult to cope with much less match. Points from Duggan, Keogh and Byrne had Boden 4 to the good after 15 minutes. Another brace of points from Duggan along with a wonderfully instinctive 'Collect, swivel & shoot' from Byrne saw the scoreboard reach the 7-point mark within the first 30 minutes. But that is only half the story. "It was a defensive masterclass," said mentor Declan Maguire who had a head on him like a sand blasted beetroot, the stresses of Intermediate football beginning to show. He added, "the back six communication and fluidity of movement have restricted Jude's to speculative long-range shots. Gannon, Hanrahan, Cullen, and Leach are the Tec7 that seals the core of Kane (Keeper) Lambert and Carolan. Now, where's the defibrillator?" Full back Jack Lambert must have dipped his hands in glue prior to the game, as any ball that was remotely in his postcode gravitated towards his languid reach like an eclipse of moths to a flame.

Starting the second period leading 7 points to 2, Boden maintained the ferocious tempo adding a further 4 points in the opening 7 minutes. McGuire, Kirwin, Baynes & Cullen carried out the hard graft of keeping the supply lines open. They created the platform that led to Flanagan lifting the net from the stanchions. Another intricate team move saw McGuire raise a green flag. While Baynes started and finished a move that resulted in a 3rd goal of the evening. Again, defensively Boden were imperious, the highlight being Lambert coming out to claim a high ball while instantaneously dumping a Jude's forward on the 'bones of his arse'. Think Cork's Diarmuid O'Sullivan against Limerick in 2001 and you have the picture. Boden were tearing into Jude's like Brendan Young into a free bar. Any time Jude's seemed to be gaining composure, up pops Leach to strip the ball from their possession. Relentless stuff. A brace of points from Kirwin and one from the ever-industrious David Keogh was enough to see out the contest comfortably.

After the game we caught up with mentor Martin Murphy and asked him for a quick word, to which he replied "Velocity". Remarkably witty for a man that has the personality and charisma of an unassembled shelving unit.

Last Man Standing


